

Day 2: March 20th, 2024




The Jaswant Thada The first location was the Jaswant Thada which is a cenotaph located in Jodhpur, in the Indian state of Rajasthan. It was built by Maharaja Sardar Singh of Jodhpur State in 1899 in memory of his father, Maharaja Jaswant Singh II, and serves as the cremation ground for the royal Rajput family of Marwar. The cenotaph's grounds feature carved gazebos, a tiered garden, and a small lake. Students were given time to explore the place freely and enjoy the breathtaking Rajputana Architecture of Jodhpur.






Day 3: March 21st, 2024






Day 4: March 22nd, 2024

Desert Safari and Adventure Sports







Jaisalmer Fort











The beautiful architecture of Patwa ki Haveli.


