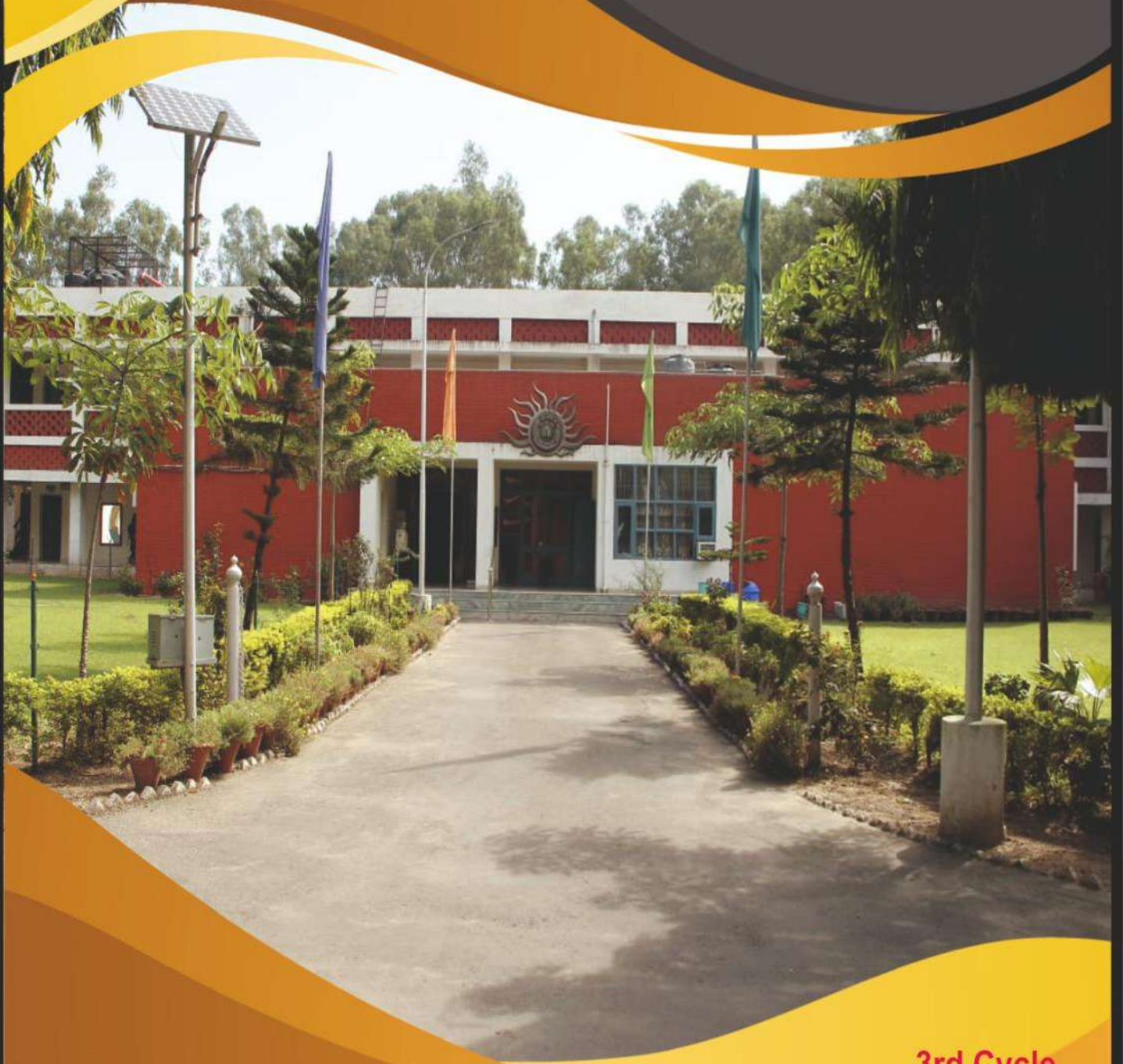

TG -7: Report of Value Education held on 2nd January, 2023

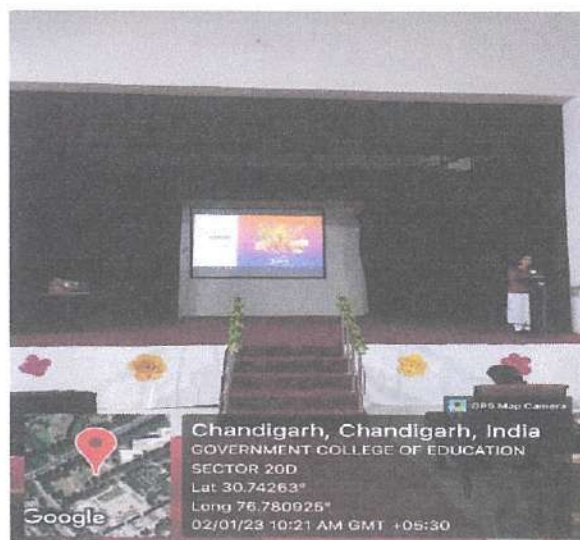
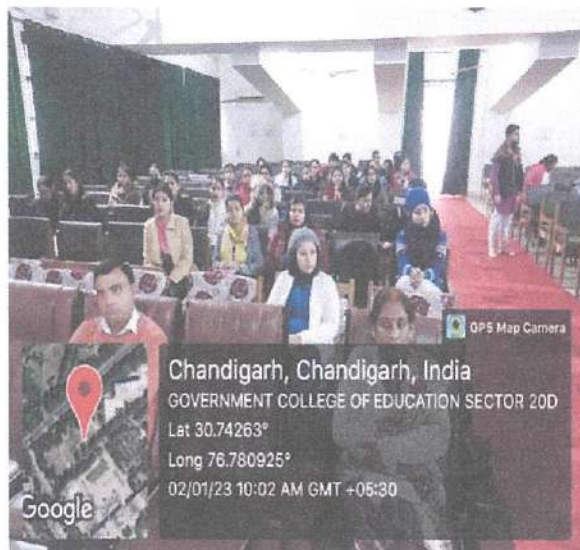
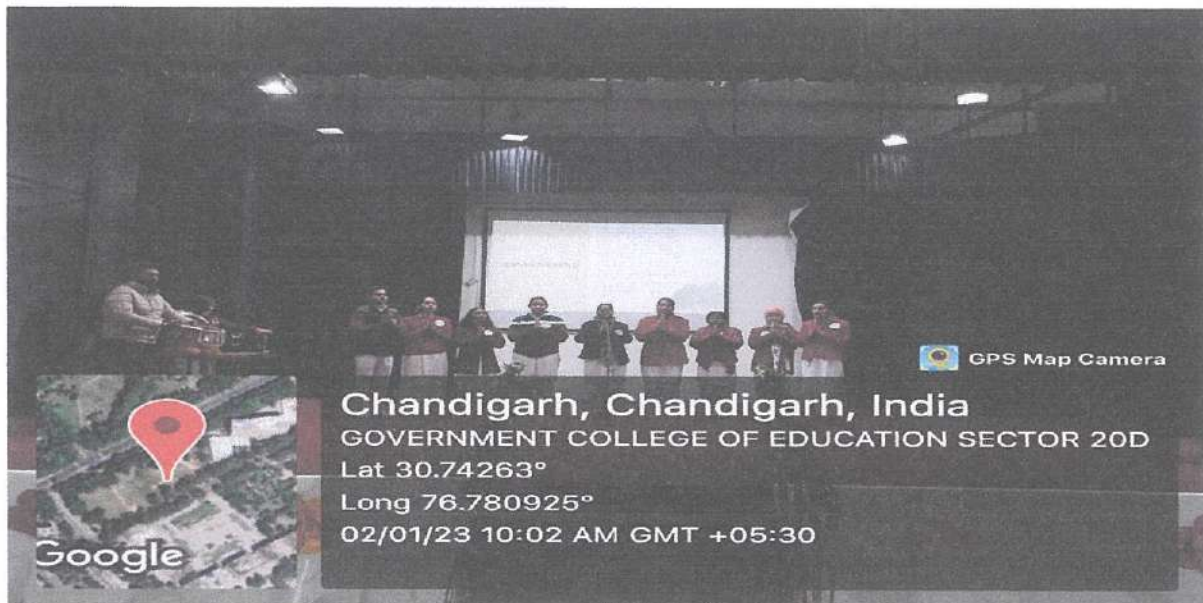

Resources

Mona and Raju were helping Amma to clean their house. "Look at all these things clothes, utensils, foodgrains, combs, bottle of honey, books, each of these has a use," said Mona. "That is why they are important," said Amma. "These are resources." What is a resource? was Raju's question to Amma. "Anything that can be used to satisfy a need is a resource," replied Amma. The water you drink when you are thirsty, the electricity you use in your house, the rickshaw you use to get home from school, the textbook you use are all resources.

Water, electricity, rickshaw, textbook have something in common. They have all been used by you, so they have utility. Utility or usability is what makes an object or substance a resource.

“ How does something become a resource? Raju now wanted to know. Amma told the children that things become resources only when they have a value. “Its use or utility gives it a value. All resources have some value.” Amma said.

Value means worth. Some resources have economic value, some do not. Eg. metals may have an economic value, a beautiful landscape may not. But both are important and satisfy human needs.

Time and technology are two important factors that can change substance into resource. Both are related to the need of the people. People themselves are the most important resource. It is their ideas, knowledge, inventions and discoveries that lead to the creation of more resources. Each discovery or invention leads to many others. The discovery of fire led to the practice of cooking and other processes while the invention of the wheel ultimately resulted in development of newer modes of transport. The technology to create hydroelectricity has turned energy in fast flowing waters into an important resource.

Resources are generally classified into natural, human made and human.

Natural Resources are that resource which are drawn from Nature and used without much modification. The air we breathe, the water in our rivers and lakes, the soils, minerals are all natural resources. Many of these resources are free gifts of nature and can be used directly.

Natural resources can be broadly categorised into renewable and non-renewable resources.

Renewable resources are those which get renewed or replenished quickly. Some of these are unlimited and are not affected by human activities, such as solar and wind energy.

Non-renewable resource are those which have a limited stock. Once the stocks are exhausted it may take thousands of years to be renewed or replenished, eg. Coal, petroleum and natural gas are some examples.

The distribution of natural resources depends upon number of physical factors like terrain, climate and altitude. The distribution of resources

is unequal because these factors differ to much over the earth.

Sometimes, natural substances become resources only when their original form has been changed. Iron ore was not a resource until people learnt to extract iron from it. People use natural resources to make buildings, bridges, roads, machinery and vehicles, which are known as human made resources. Technology is also a human made resource.

"So people like us use natural resources to make human made resources," said Mona nodding in understanding. "Yes," Raju said.

People can make the best use of nature to create more resources when they have the knowledge, skill and the technology to do so. That is why human beings are a special resource. People are human resources. Education and health help in making people a valuable resource. Improving the quality of people's skills so that they are able to create more resources is known as human resource development.

Mona had a nightmare. She dreamt that all the water on the earth had dried up

and all the trees cut down. There was no shade and nothing to eat or drink. People were suffering and roaming around desperately, looking for food and shade.

She told her mother about the dream. "Amma, can this really happen?" she asked.

"Yes," Amma replied. "If we are not careful then even renewable resources can become very scarce and the non-renewable ones can definitely get exhausted". "What can we do about it," Raju asked. "Lots," replied Amma.

Using resources carefully and giving them time to get renewed is called resource conservation.

Balancing the need to use resources and also conserve them for the future is called sustainable development. There are many ways of conserving resources. Each person can contribute by reducing consumption, recycling, and reusing them. Ultimately it makes a difference because all our lives are linked.

That evening the children and their friends made packets and shopping bags out of old newspapers, discarded clothes and baskets from bamboo sticks. "We will give a few to every family we know," said Mona. "After all it is for a very good cause," said Mustafa, "To save our resources and to keep our earth

alive."

"I am going to be very careful not to waste paper," said Jessy. "Many trees are cut down to make paper," she explained.

"I will see that electricity is not wasted in my house," shouted Mustafa. "Electricity comes from water and coal."

"I will make sure that water is not wasted at home," said Asha. "Every drop of water is precious"

"Together we can make a difference!" chorused the children.

These are some of the things Mona, Raju and their friends did. What about you? How are you going to help in conserving resources?

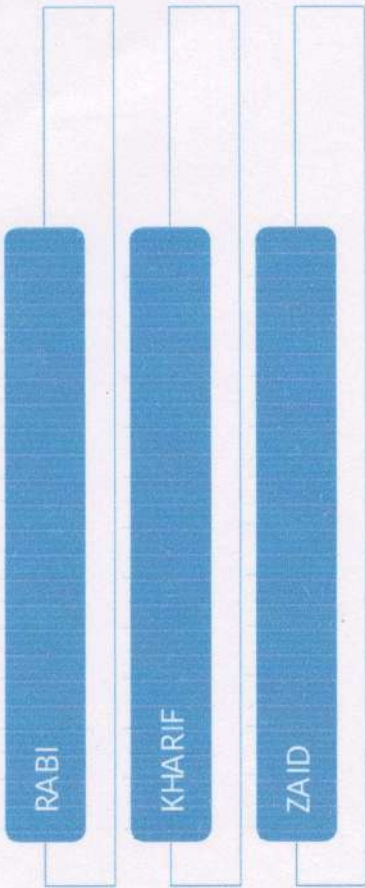

MULTIMEDIA LAB

There is a multimedia lab that is meant for provoking radical changes in the teaching process in the coming decades,

particularly as smart student as they discover they can go beyond the limits of traditional teaching method. There is indeed a move away from the transmission or passive learner model of learning to the experiential learning. In some instances teachers may become more like guides and mentors or facilitators of learning leading students along a learning path, rather than the more traditional role of being the primary providers of information and understanding. The students, not teachers, become the core of the teaching and learning process. This is a sensitive and highly politicized subject among educators, so educational software is often positioned as enriching the learning process, not as a potential substitute for traditional teacher based methods. School has one multimedia room, It has a sitting capacity of around 50 students , Teachers generally go with their students to show their presentation on different topics. 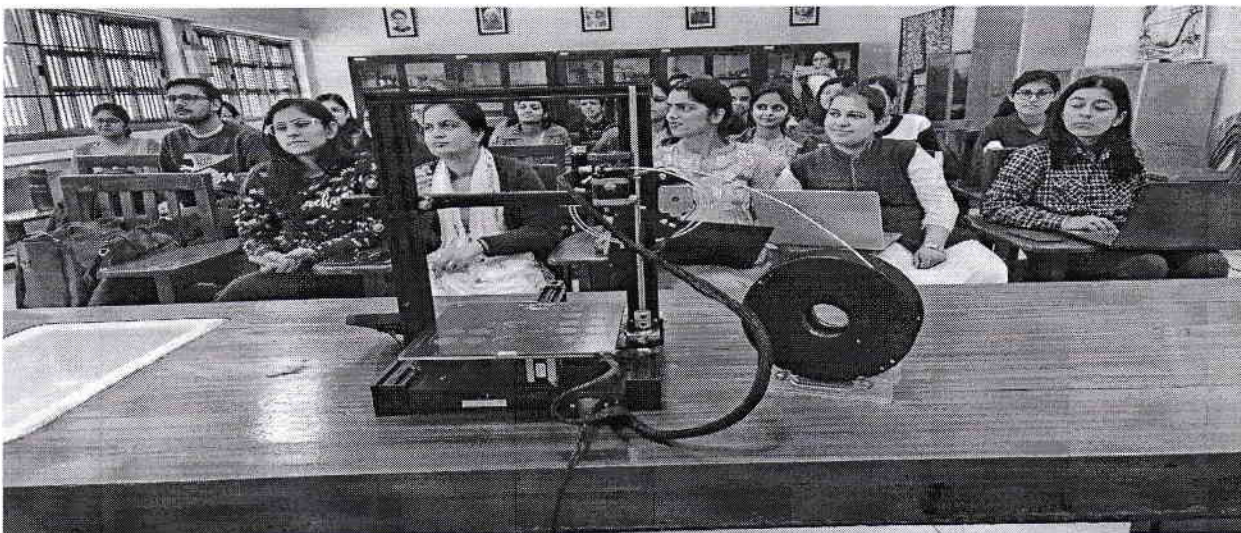
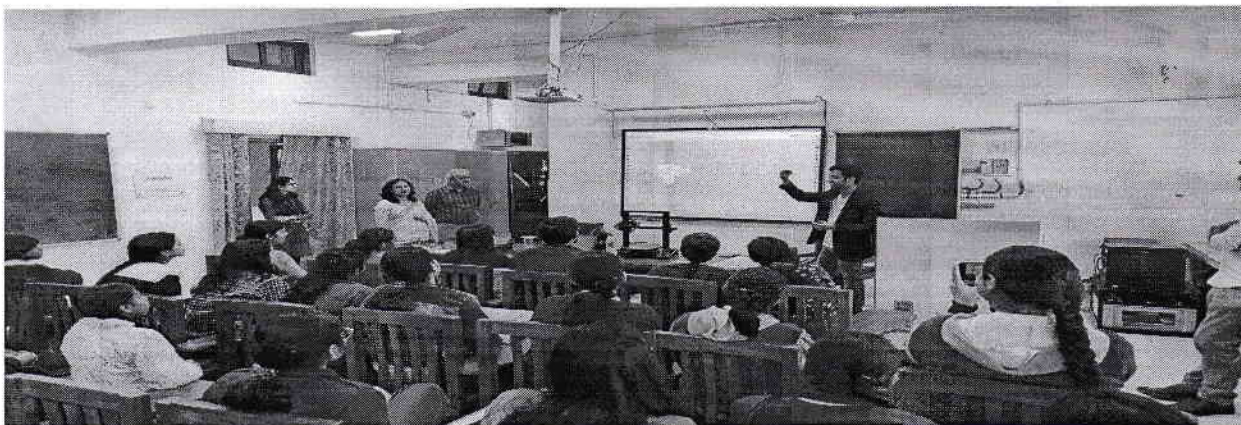
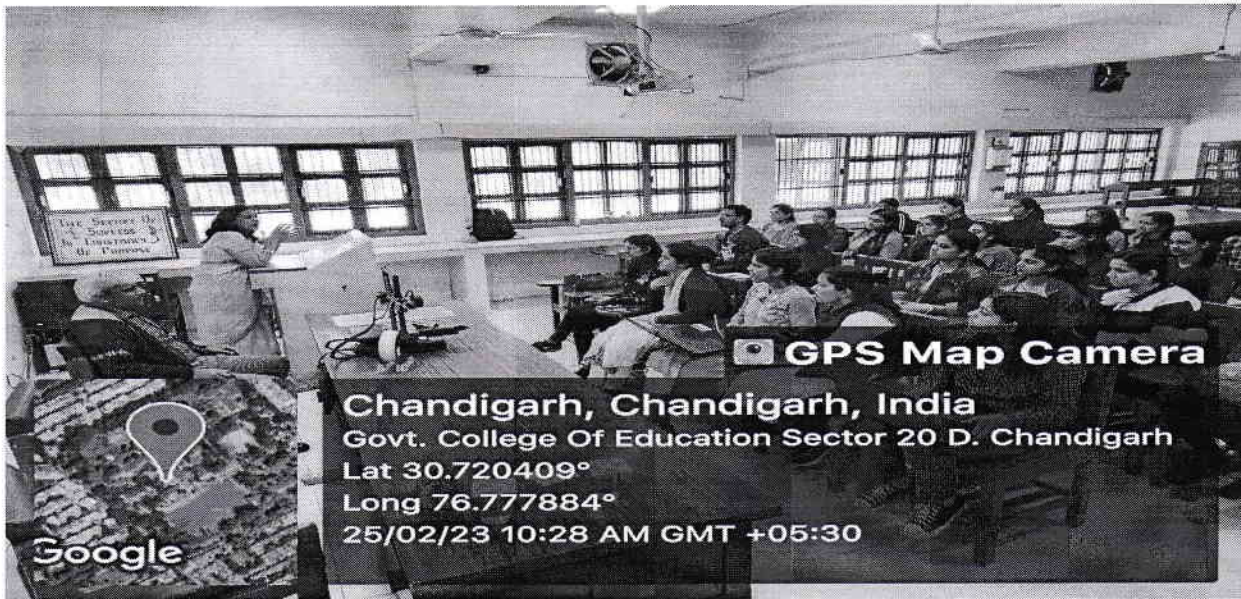
NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY

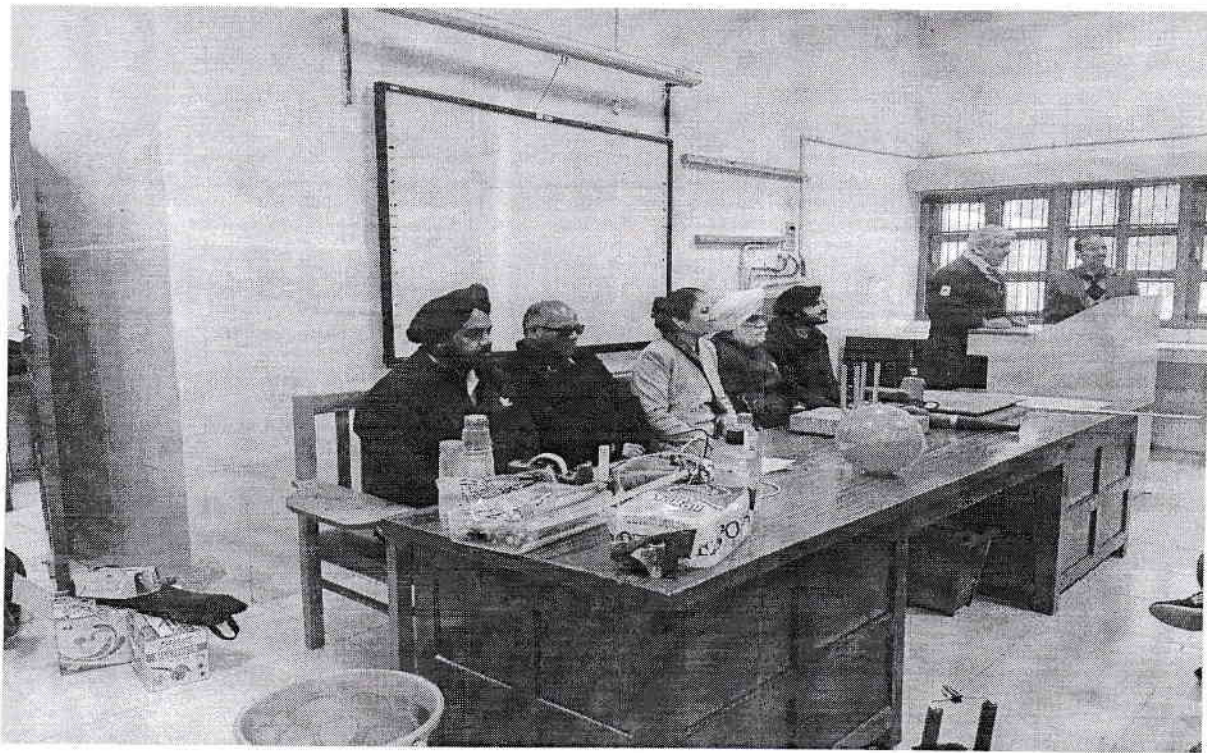
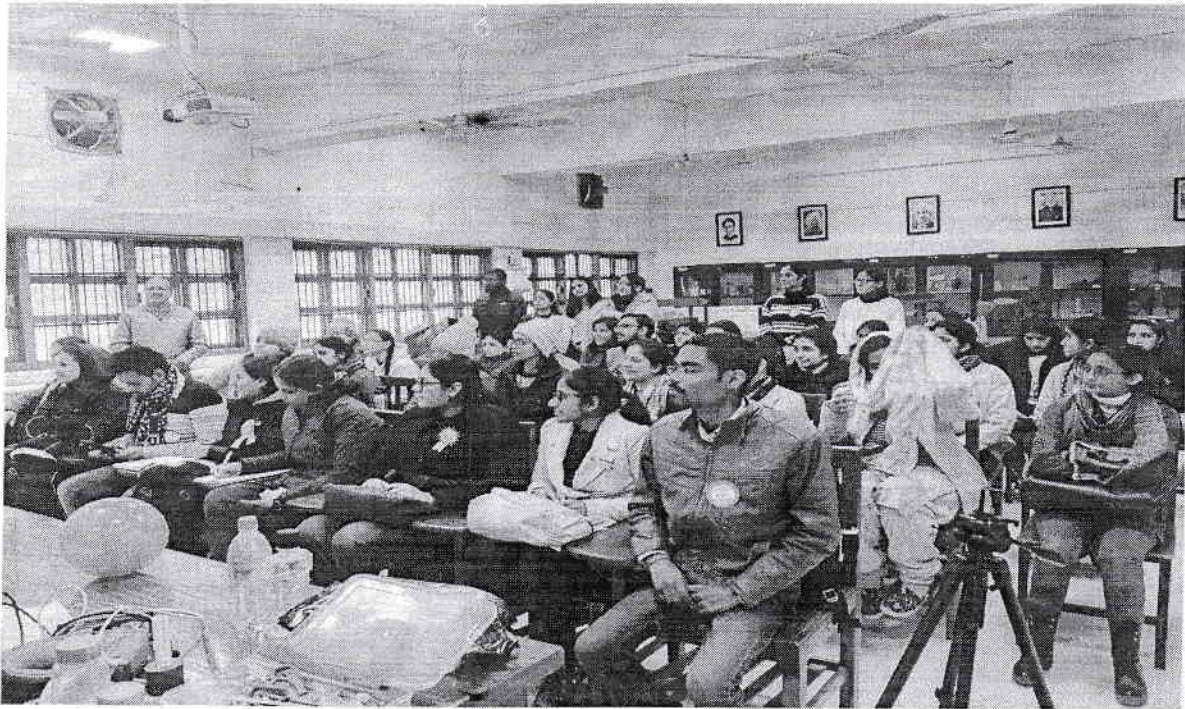
REPORT OF SCIENCE CLUB 'NAVONMESH' ACTIVITY -

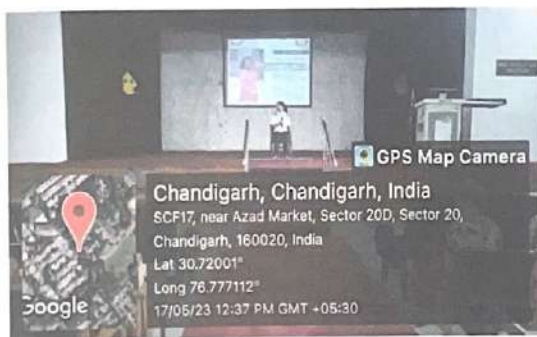

REPORT



The Skill Development Committee of the Government College of Education Sector 20 D Chandigarh on the Day 2 of the ongoing Value Added Course on the Capacity Building of Pupil Teachers on Applied Skills was conducted on collaboration of the Placement Cell of the college. The day consisted of three invited speakers and followed by in house panel discussion.

The first session started with Dr. Ravneet Chawla introducing Mrs. Indu Aggarwal from *Disha Consultants* who is a senior corporate and school children and teacher trainer with a diverse experience.

Mrs. Indu Aggarwal began her session by asking questions about the challenges the schools have and gradually transitioned to the gaps the employers find while employing the teachers. The objective was to bring to the listeners the career world expectations, assess their understanding and introducing them to the trending employable talent parameters. She suggested that students should work on their strengths instead of just focusing on their weaknesses and the same should be instructed further to their students. For this purpose she suggested that they should read books like 'Igniting Young Minds'. She referred to the expectation of NEP 2020 in terms of experiential learning. The most important skills that a teacher can have are communication skills, emotional strengths, sensitivity, channelization skills and mentorship. A teacher must also have counselling skills of being empathetic and non judgmental so as to effectively deal with students, parents, officers, and other stakeholders. The whole session was very informative. The speaker was very encouraging throughout the session and inspired students present to be passionate about their profession and to become good teachers.

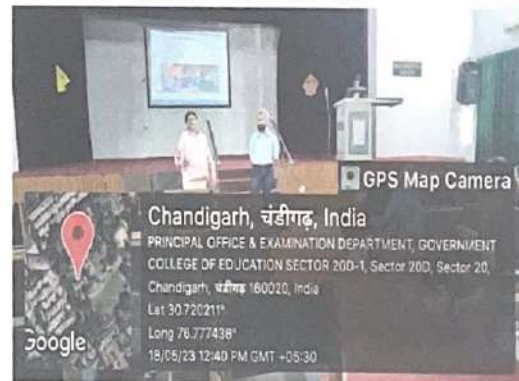
The next session of the day was by Mr. Maninder Singh Bajwa associated with *Eapanza Innovations*, Mohali. He's a software engineer by profession and is working in EdTech

sector since 2008. The session started with Mr. Maninder asking question of why students present wanted to become a teacher. He explained that the top most priority of a teacher should be influencing the life of their students in a better way. The main motive of this session was informing students about various opportunities that they have as a teacher in addition to just teaching in schools. The objective was to crystalize the ideas of the changing mode of teaching-learning in the hybrid mode, to introduce the opportunities on developing digital content and orienting them to the applied employability skills. He discussed with three case studies. The first one was about Punjab, Second was about a project with Central Government and NCERT during the lockdown to develop e-content including episodes and web series, the third was about a project with Haryana Government in which sir and his team worked to develop software for the tablets commissioned by the government for their school students so that they can learn effectively. AI technology and its effects on teaching and learning were also discussed in detail. This interactive session was eye opening for the students and it educated them about the different ways they can use technology to make their teaching style more effective. The students were then provided with refreshment.

The third session started by Mr. Abhinav Dogra who is MD at *Chetanya Career Consultants*, Mohali Immigration and Career Consultant. He introduced the skill of refinement for resume writing. He also emphasised professional e mail writing as soft skills for pupil teachers. Through his experience he shared about opportunities of overseas employability and the skills required to work upon. His session was very informative and interactive with students asking questions throughout. Mr Abhinav also brought forth important details of how to write formal professional e mails, the tone and language to be used. He mentioned countrywise documentation of popular overseas destinations and the correct time and format for applying. He touched upon language, size, and inserting hyperlinks in the resume to make it brief and yet complete. The session was interactive and brought to light points often ignored by applicants.

The concluding session of the day comprised a panel discussion headed by Dr. Ravneet Chawla with valuable participation of Dr. Upasna Thapliyal and Mr. Ravinder Kumar. The objective of the panel discussion was to review the days learning and engage to brainstorm new ideas for upcoming sessions.

The Third day of the Capacity Building Program organised by Skill Development Committee started with Dr. Kusum introducing Mrs Charanjeet who is an Assistant Professor at Dev Samaj College, Sec-36, Chandigarh. The objective of the session was to provide instruction and guidance on the concept of "*Micro Teaching*".

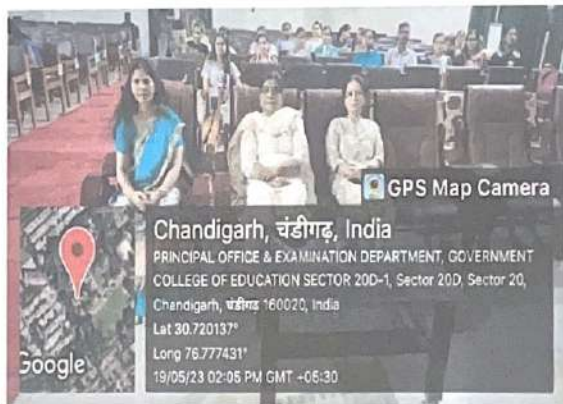
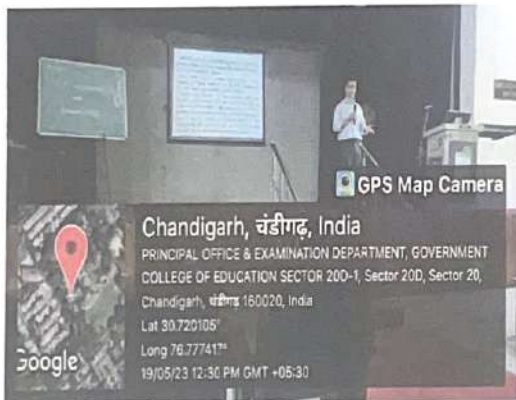
The session aimed to provide training to teachers in a simulated environment. She covered various aspects of microteaching, including its characteristics and phases. Additionally, she emphasized the significance of learning objectives in teaching and discussed the Bloom's taxonomy and its domains. She also addressed the importance of addressing student's emotional learning and provided guidance on introducing lessons and utilizing reinforcement techniques using different approaches. Furthermore, she focused on specific skills such as the skill of introduction, skill of explanation, skill of stimulus variation, skill of probing, and skill of asking divergent questions. Overall, the session proved highly advantageous for the pupil teachers in their professional development. The students were then provided with refreshments.

The next session of the day was by Mr. Anand Mohan Sharma, the director of Jan ShikshanSansthan, Mohali which is sponsored by Ministry of Skill development & entrepreneurship (GOI). He had impact on many lives and aims to turn India into skill India. During the session, he began by discussing various avenues for skill development, such as ITIs (Industrial Training Institutes) and government polytechnics. He then delved into the Skill Development Initiative School Scheme (SDIS), which was initiated in 2014 to cater to the educational levels of 5th, 8th, 10th, and 12th students, focusing on Modular Employable Skills. The next topic covered was the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), a flagship program by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, aimed at fostering the skill development of the country's youth. The training programs conducted through the Ministry of Micro, Small, and Medium Industries (MSME) were also highlighted. Another institution discussed was JAN Shiksha Sansthan, formerly part of the Human Resource Development (HRD) Ministry, which provides various courses with a significant reservation of seats for illiterate individuals and those who have completed up to 8th grade, while 20 percent of seats are allocated for students who have completed 12th grade. The entire session proved to be highly informative.

The third session was started by Dr. M. Dhrakshayani. She spoke on use of ICT and methods in teaching and learning. She emphasised about impact of student learning; teachers being digitally literate and understand how to integrate it into curriculum. She also discussed how schools use a diverse set of ICT tools to communicate, create, disseminate, store, and manage

information and outlined the ICT curriculum or lesson plan followed, including the specific topics covered, teaching methods employed, and resources utilized. She also explained how the curriculum aligns with relevant educational standards and objectives, Teaching Strategies and Approaches. The session was very informative and interactive as students were asking questions throughout. The concluding session of the day comprised discussion headed by Dr. Kusum with students about learning experiences. The Vote of Thanks was given by Shachi and the day concluded with the National Anthem.

The Skill Development Committee of Government College of Education, Sector 20-D, Chandigarh organized a session on the fourth day of the ongoing Value-Added Course on the Capacity Building of Pupil Teachers on Applied Skills.

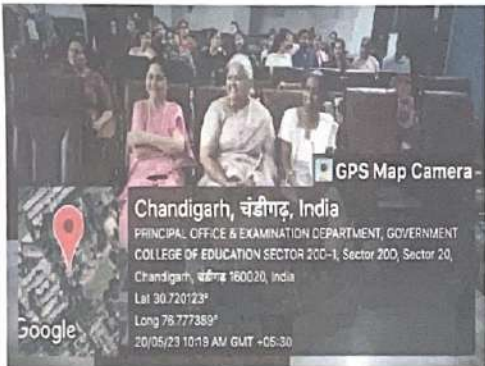
The first session was started by The Skill Development Committee Incharge, Dr. Balwinder Kaur introducing Dr. Jasvir Chahal who's been a member of teaching faculty here, at GCE 20-D, Chandigarh serving from 1989-2016, ending her tenure as the vice principal of the college. She excels as a teacher, mentor, and researcher, and remains actively involved in the field of education, serving as a visiting faculty at multiple universities. Principal, Dr. Sapna Nanda welcomed the resource person and highlighted her achievements. The objective of her session was "*Self Development- The core to Personality Development*".

The session primarily centred on self-development. It started with an activity wherein the pupil teachers were required to identify their emotions and express what they were experiencing at that specific moment. The purpose of this exercise was to cultivate self-awareness among them, as awareness serves as the initial stage in the process of self-development. She emphasised on the significance of a teacher's role in shaping young minds, highlighting the crucial need for educators to prioritize self-care and gain a profound understanding of them. This self-awareness enables teachers to effectively impart these insights to their students, thereby enriching their educational experience. The session was very mind opening and interesting, the main takeaway being, life is very unpredictable and uncertain, so pupil teachers should learn to deal with these uncertainties and keep on developing they to deal with these head on and attain self-actualisation.

The second session featured a film called "*Notebook*". 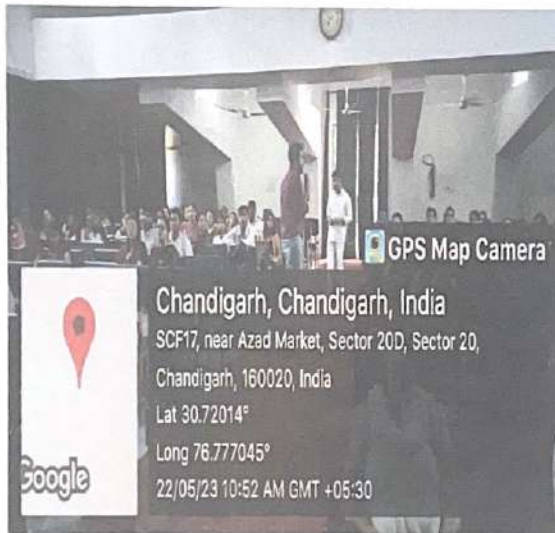

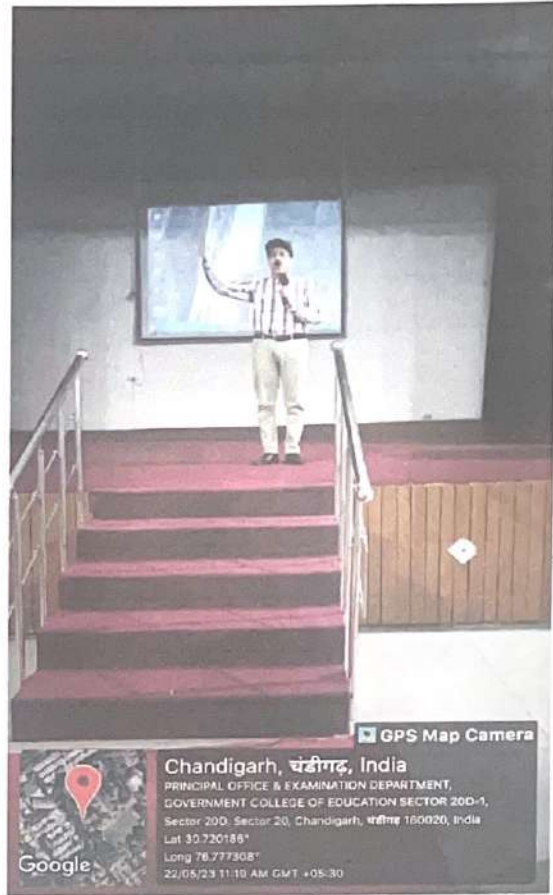
He talked on what is the importance of saving environment and what are the various ways in which one can contribute towards saving environment on an individual level. He explained

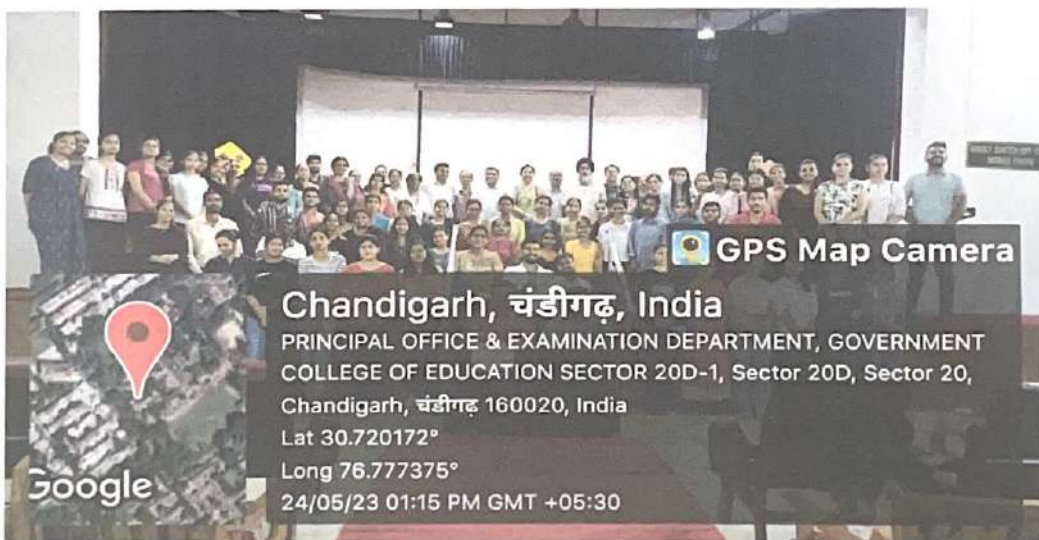
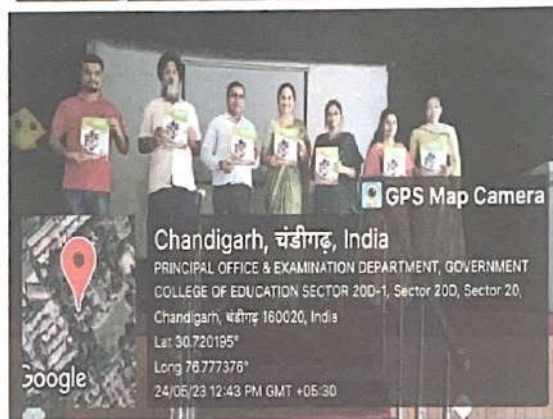

Course coordinator Dr. Neelam Paul and yoga instructor Mr. Harcharan Singh managed the program. Day 13: 6th January, 2023

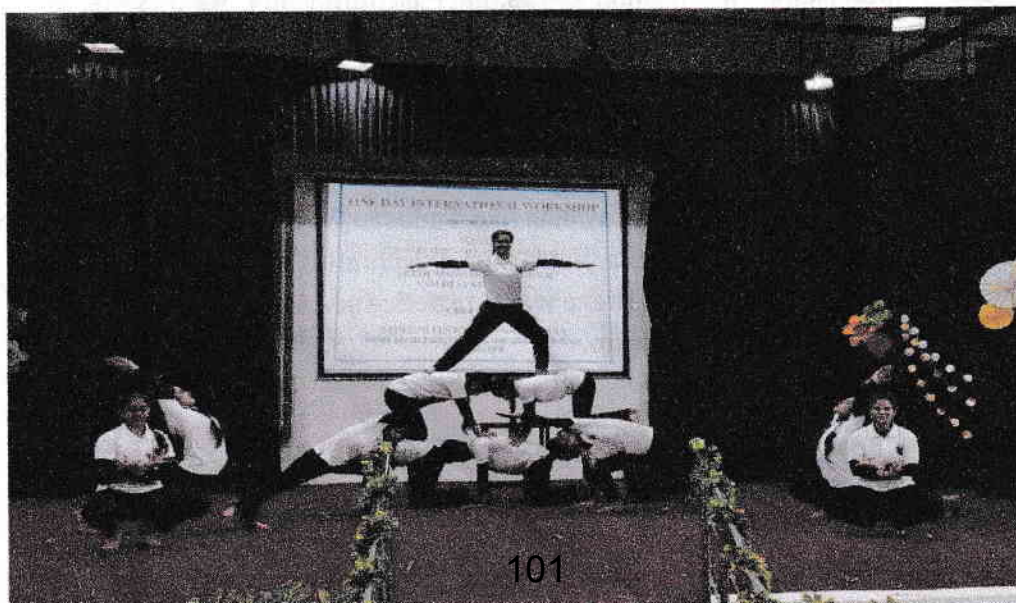

The Legal Literacy Cell of the college celebrated the National Legal Services Day on November 09, 2022. The resource person of the day was Ld. Sh. Surender Kumar, *Additional District and Sessions Judge (Haryana cadre) on deputation in Chandigarh as Member secretary, State Legal Services Authority U.T. Chandigarh*. Samiksha and Aaina (executive members L.L.C.) initiated the session by speaking about the National Legal Service Day and why is it celebrated on 9th November every year. Samiksha introduced briefly about the Resource Person to the faculty and students of P.G.D.G.C.; M.Ed. and B.Ed.

Ld. Sh. Surender Kumar (Resource Person), informed the students about downloading NALSA app, POCSO (Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences) Act, 2012 and how to file a complaint before the magistrate for cases of sexual assault and domestic violence. He also talked about how a FIR can be filed and what is the procedure followed after someone gets arrested. He specifically mentioned how children, women, differently abled persons, labourer's are the most vulnerable to the human rights violation. The prevalent criminal phenomenon of child and women trafficking was also discussed. The resource person highlighted about the responsibility of a teacher as a protector in a child's life; Child Protection Act; women rights; domestic abuse; sexual harassment at workplace etc.

Sir, also briefed the audience about basic provisions of Indian Law; role of Fundamental Duties with reference to Fundamental Rights and various cyber and IT Act, 2000 for curbing cyber crimes. The role of services provided by the State Legal Aid Service Authority, Chandigarh to vulnerable sections of the society were also shared by the Resource Person.

At the end of the session, queries were put forward by the students regarding various issues with the services of Free Legal Aid. The resource person answered all the legal queries with examples as per legal protocol followed in India. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Abha (Chief Executive Member L.L.C.) which was followed by National Anthem.

REPORT ON

“IMPROVING COMMUNICATION SKILLS: Some Suggestions for an Effective Interview”

(4th November, 2022)

The Government College of Education, Sector 20D, Chandigarh organized a lecture **under the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** signed with the Regional Institute of English, Sector 32, Chandigarh on the theme- **“Improving Communication Skills: Some Suggestions for an Effective Interview”** in the Society Period on 4th November, 2022 from 12:00 noon to 1:20 p.m. for the B.Ed., M.Ed. and PGDG&C students of the college. The Resource Person for the event was Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak, Assistant Professor, Regional Institute of English, Sector-32, Chandigarh. Principal of the college, Dr. A.K. Srivastava formally welcomed the resource person of the day. A brief introduction of the guest was given to students by Dr. Sheojee Singh and Dr. Anjali Puri, Associate Professors, Government College of Education, Sector 20, Chandigarh.

In his address to students Dr. Gopal Ji discussed about the varied types of communication- verbal, non-verbal, listening, visual, signs etc. He also talked about how important our body language (65%) is over our spoken words (7%) and actions (28%), which justifies the proverb” Actions speak louder than words”. He emphasized that communication is not just the sounds produced but a language that is used not only in terms of grammatical sense but it should be meaningful in the context with proper gestures, feelings and emotions. Also, barriers we have to keep in mind for an effective communication were discussed. He focused on simple but effective tools that can make our communication effective as sticking to the objective, being sincere, brief and precise, relaxed, empathetic, giving and receiving feedback, being visual and being respectful towards others in communication.

Further, he laid emphasis on being an active listener so as to fully understand before responding. Being active listeners we must also learn to, “talk less, listen more”. We must read more closely, the emotional side of the speaker and be mindful about our own words

because as it is rightly said," Be careful with your words. Once they are said, they can be only forgiven, not forgotten.

In addition, he also presented interview skills in a broader perspective including the types of interviews, formal introduction, formal dressing etc. Also, the positive effect of an enthusiastic voice during a telephonic interview was also discussed about. Great emphasis was laid on some game changing kind words like PLEASE and THANK YOU. He also highlighted that, how a beaming smile could have a positive effect on the interviewer. He motivated the students to face the fears like anxiety and nervousness by preparing well, in advance, extensive reading and research, or even attending a mock interview.

At the end, a question answer session was held wherein students asked their queries and discussed their experiences after his motivating talk.


The program concluded with a formal vote of thanks extended by Dr. Rajni Thakur, Coordinator for the event, towards the resource person, the worthy principal, IQAC committee, the faculty members and the participating students for all the cooperation and support to make the event a success.




The Placememnt Cell of The Government College of Education Sector-20 Chandigarh created a collaborative session of the day with the specially designed International Workshop
