

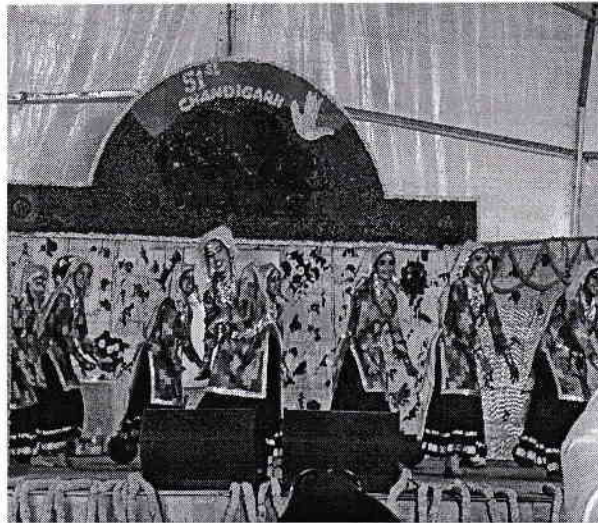

The Post-Graduate Institute of Medical Education, Research (PGI), the premier health institution of the region, has come under scanner of the Chandigarh Pollution Control Commission (CPCC) for violating norms of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) over charge of wastewater.

The CPCC has found the PGI has been releasing untreated wastewater into the sewerage system of the Municipal Corporation past many years.

The CPCC had issued show-cause notice to the PGI for seeking an explanation why a sewerage treatment plant (STP) and an effluent treatment plant (ETP) had not been installed by the PGI, which treats the effluent from the patients from the region. The CPCC has issued a show-cause notice to the PGI on Friday, which says that the PGI has been releasing untreated wastewater into the sewerage system of the Municipal Corporation past many years.
