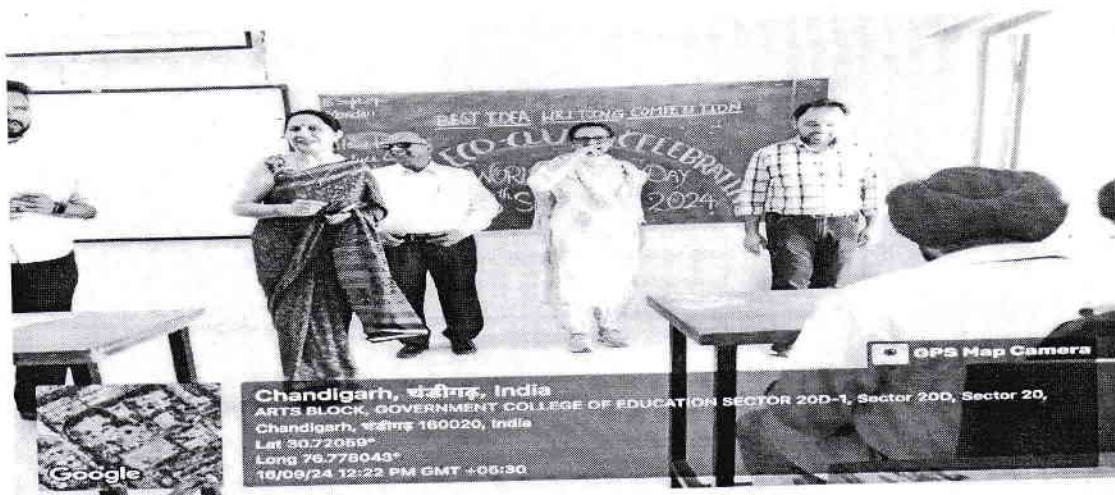




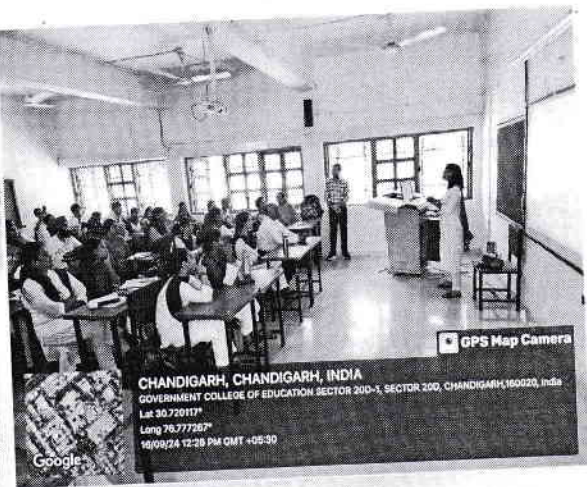
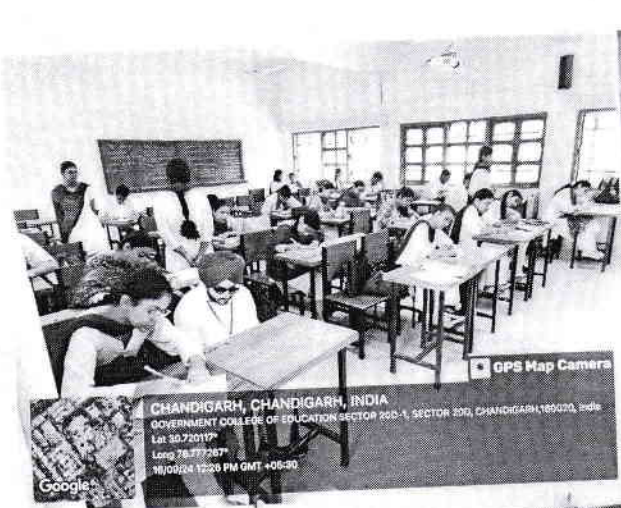
GOVERNMENT COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, CHANDIGARH
